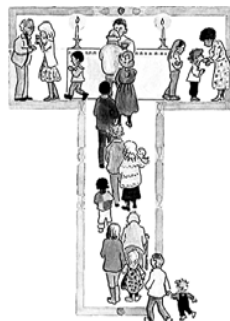

The activities in this leaflet are for children of all ages and their families. Perhaps you simply want to introduce your child to church. Perhaps your child has been baptised recently and you are looking for ways to build on your baptismal promises. Maybe you are interested in being baptised or confirmed yourself. When children are baptised the church community undertakes to support parents and god-parents in the responsibility of bringing up children as practising Christians. We want them to know and love God for themselves, and to understand how much God loves them. In baptism we say that we will

- ◆ welcome and support your child;
- ◆ pray for them;
- ◆ draw them into the church community by our own example;
- ◆ walk with them on the Christian journey;
- ◆ help them to take their place in the life and worship of the church.

Whether or not your child has been baptised, or whether you are considering it, this leaflet offers just some of the ways in which we can help you and your family feel at home in the church community, share in worship, make Christian friends and learn more about God. We warmly invite you to join in with them, or to contact us to find out more.

Children are members of the Christian community in their own right and in the Droitwich parish we take their needs, and those of their families, seriously.

So if you come to a church service or to an activity we want to welcome you warmly. Some occasions are obviously more geared to small children than others, but all our churches have a soft area and quiet toys, and there are also toilet facilities in each building. Please feel free to bring with you anything (such as a favourite book or quiet toy, or a drink) which will help your child feel settled. We follow the Safeguarding Children policy of the Worcester diocese in all our activities.
